

## Questions and Answers

**Q. My daughter is a very good player but does not want to commit to playing through June. Can she still play on a regional team?**

A. Absolutely. We are very aware that high school girls have a lot on their plate, and many of them just need a break in the spring as the semester winds down.

**Q. My daughter wants to play for a National Team. Are there separate tryout dates for National Teams?**

A. Yes, the dates of tryouts are as follows:

13U    October 25th 2pm-4pm  
          October 28th 5pm-7pm

14U    October 25th 4pm- 6pm  
          October 28th 7pm-9pm

15U    November 9<sup>th</sup> 5:30pm-7:30pm  
          November 11<sup>th</sup> 7:30pm-9:00pm

16U    November 8<sup>th</sup> 2pm-4pm  
          November 10<sup>th</sup> 5:30pm-7:30pm

17U    November 8<sup>th</sup> 4pm-6pm  
          November 11<sup>th</sup> 5:30pm-7:30pm

18U    November 8<sup>th</sup> 6pm-8pm  
          November 11<sup>th</sup> 5:30pm-7:30pm

**Q. If my daughter does not make a national team, can she still play on a regional team?**

A. Yes, if your daughter does not make the national team she will automatically be considered for one of the regional teams.

**Q. My daughter plays other sports; can she still play at CUVC?**

A. Yes. We would recommend that both parents and players look at the demand of all schedules prior to the start of the seasons. We encourage girls to participate in sports and other school activities that they choose. Understand that the demand of the National teams will be more than those on the regional teams. Also, missing several practices will be considered into playing time at tournaments.

**Q. Will there be a penalty if my daughter misses practice because of a school sport or because of a big test the next day?**

A. No (within what is reasonable to miss). One thing has been made very clear to our coaches is school sports and grades come first. This is also why we encourage girls playing a school sport (soccer, basketball, softball, etc.) to stick with a regional team.

**Q. I notice that several of your coaches are also coaches at various high schools. Will the placement of my daughter be determined by the high school she attends?**

A. Absolutely not. Decisions will be made based on the ability of the player, and will be made by a group of people, not just that team's particular coaches.

**Q. What if my daughter does not make a club team?**

A. For those that do not make a travelling team, Carolina Courts also offers in-house recreational teams. These teams also include the opportunity to continue training at a high level with the option of additional Jump/Workout sessions to the RISE leagues.

**Q. My daughter is too young to play, is there a place she can get involved.**

A. Two places, actually. Carrie Powell will still be running her UVC recreational teams at Weddington High School in the spring, and Carolina Courts offers instructional leagues as well as recreational teams for younger girls.

**Q. What if we cannot pay for the cost of club completely up front?**

A. While CUVC strives to keep cost down, we know there are situations that can keep players from participating. We will offer several fundraisers opportunities throughout the club season to help offset the cost. CUVC also provides payment plans in which the fee is broken into several installments throughout the season.
